PROJECT LEAD THE WAY GATEWAY COURSES TO BE ADDED AT MJHS

On Tuesday evening, September 22nd, the South Conway County Public School Foundation will host the 16th Annual “Race to the Future” Fund-raising Event. Funds raised during this year’s campaign will be used to implement Gateway courses at Morrilton Junior High School. The U.S. Department of Commerce estimates that jobs in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) will grow 17% by 2018 – nearly double the growth for non-STEM fields. By 2018, it is estimated that the United States will have more than 1.2 million unfilled STEM jobs.

To better equip learners at Morrilton Junior High School for these demands, the South Conway County School District will begin offering the Gateway curriculum developed by Project Lead the Way (PLTW), the nation’s leading provider of K-12 STEM programs. MJHS will offer two foun-

dational Gateway courses, Design & Modeling (fall 2015) and Automation & Robotics (spring 2016). The approximate start-up cost for technology and equipment for these two courses is \$40,000. In Design & Modeling, students will apply the design process to solve problems and understand the influence of creativity and innovation in their lives. Using Autodesk design software, students will create a virtual image of their playground and furniture designs, as well as their innovative solutions.

In Automation & Robotics, students will trace the history, development, and influence of automation and robotics as they learn about mechanical systems, energy transfer, machine automation, and computer control systems. Students will use the VEX Robotics platform to design, build, and program real-world objects, such as traffic lights, toll booths,

and robotic arms. More information about Project Lead the Way and Gateway is available at pltw.org.

The South Conway County School District is excited about offering this program of study at MJHS. Donations from the South Conway County Public School Foundation will be used to purchase computer technology and equipment necessary for the foundational units of Design & Modeling and Automation & Robotics.

The South Conway County Public School Foundation congratulates Patty Rainey on her retirement after a total of 33 years with South Conway County School District - 25 of those years in the counselor's office at Morrilton High School.

Since the foundation began, Mrs. Rainey has been invaluable to the Foundation board. We have appreciated her constant help and support, her will-

ingness to always take the time to give us advice, and her organization and efficiency with the scholarship program. She has made a big difference in the lives of many students.

During her years at Morrilton High School, Rainey developed a plan to improve ACT scores; the Devil Dog Helping Hands program, in which seniors tutor and mentor younger students for one period

of the school day; and the Morrilton High School Student Pride program. She established student recognition programs and increased the number and monetary value of scholarships received by seniors each year, with the total this year reaching approximately \$4 million.

MHS NATIONAL MERIT WINNER

2015 Morrilton High School graduate and captain of the State Champion MHS Quiz Bowl team, Jonathan Rankin, has been named a National Merit Winner.

The National Merit Scholarship Program is an academic competition for recognition and scholarships that began in 1955. High school students enter the National Merit Program by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying test- a test which serves as an initial screen of approximately 1.5 million students per year and by meeting published program entry and participation requirements.

Less than 1% of each state's

high school seniors qualify for this distinguished program. Jonathan's test scores qualified him as a National Merit Finalist. Because of this standing he received the Chancellor's Merit Scholarship from the University of Arkansas in Fayetteville. This scholarship has a value of up to \$40,000 over a four year period. In addition, the National Merit Scholarship Program has awarded him a stipend for four years. The Sam M. Walton College of Business Honors Program has also awarded Jonathan a \$2,000 scholarship renewable for four years based on his impressive credentials.

Jonathan also received the



Arkansas Governor's Distinguished Scholarship based on his ACT score, academic grade point average, and his standing as a National Merit Finalist. This scholarship is valued at \$10,000 for four years.

Jonathan is enrolled in the U of A Sam M. Walton College of Business Honors Program for the fall. He plans to pursue finance

as his field of study.

The South Conway County Public School Foundation congratulates Jonathan and all of the educators within the South Conway County School District that have supported his educational journey.

DISTRICT SEEKS SUPPORT FOR IMPROVEMENTS

The South Conway County School District is seeking a 3.9 mill property tax increase to fund proposed improvements on four district campuses. The improvements are projected to cost approximately \$24 million.

The construction projects would include building safe rooms on the primary, elementary, and high school campuses, installing enhanced security features at all school entrances, improved parking, and a new arena/multipurpose building to be built between Morrilton Junior and Senior High Schools.

The arena would serve as the high school and junior high safe room and could be used for graduations, sporting events, and community meetings,

Superintendent Shawn-Halbrook said all schools would be enclosed so that students would not have to go outside to get to different areas of the campus or access the safe rooms. All of the safe rooms would be open to the public during tornado warnings. Halbrook also stressed the need for improved security at the district's schools, both from natu-

ral disasters and human threats such as school shootings.

The South Conway County School District currently has the second lowest millage in the surrounding area.

The Foundation Board of Directors invited John Gibson, president of the school board, to share details of the district's plan and answer questions from the board members. After discussing the issue the South Conway County Public School Foundation Board voted to support the district's millage request.
