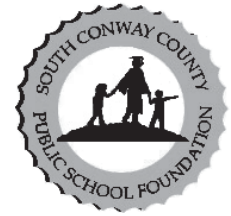

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## BILL STACKS HANDS LEADERSHIP OF FOUNDATION OFF TO NEXT GENERATION

At the Foundation's January meeting Bill Stacks was honored for his selfless service to the South Conway County Public School Foundation. Stacks has served as President of the South Conway County Public School Foundation since its inception in 1995.

Founded by Stacks, the late Nathan Gordon and the late Dr. T.C. Vaughan, the Foundation has served the South Conway County School District over the last 15 years by raising funds to purchase technology hardware and soft-

ware, administering private scholarships, assisting with Project Graduation, and lending support for several grant opportunities within the district. Over a million dollars has been donated to the district as a result of the Foundation's efforts.

At the annual December election of officers Steve Pruitt was elected to serve the Foundation as the new President. Stacks will continue serving as a director on the board to ensure a smooth transition. Other officers of the Foundation are Katherine Foust, Vice-

President, Patty Allison Shipp, Secretary, and Sarah Norman Ryals, Treasurer.

New President, Steve Pruitt, is a 1975 graduate of Morrilton High School. He owns Mr. Quik-Lube in Morrilton and has three children, two that are graduates of Morrilton High School and another one currently in the 10th grade at MHS.

The Foundation is governed by a 13 member board. The names of all board members can be found on the back page of this newsletter. The newest member of the board is Lawana Lyon who was elected in January to fill a vacant position. Lyon is currently also co-chairing the 2010 Project Graduation Committee.

## GRADE INFLATION VERY LOW IN SOUTH CONWAY COUNTY DISTRICT

The South Conway County School District was recently notified by the Arkansas Department of Education that it is among the best in the state in regard to grade inflation.

Shawn Halbrook, director of Learning Services, explained that a district's grade inflation is calculated by comparing the

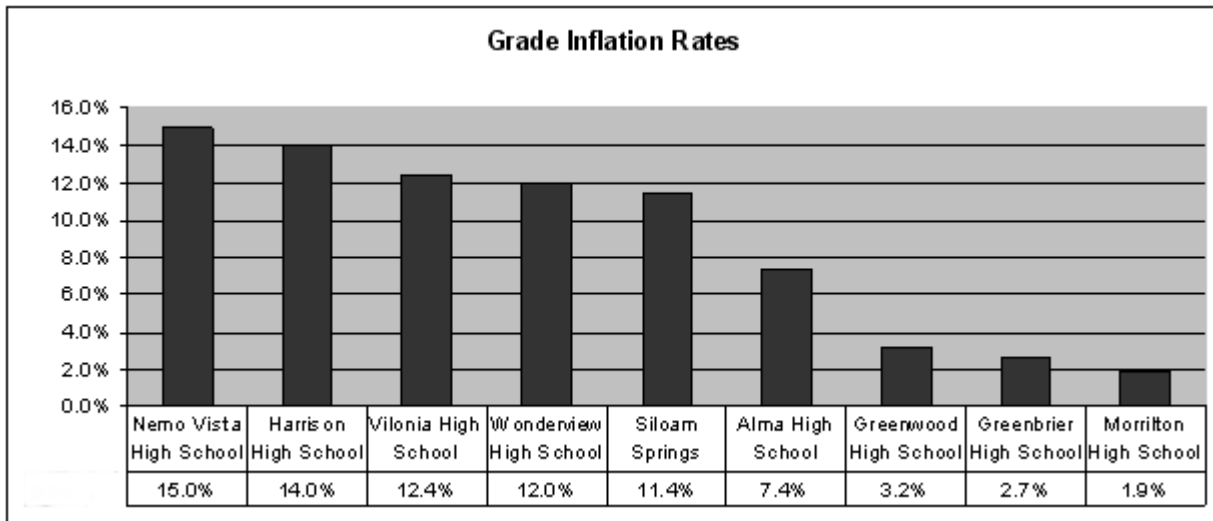
number of students who received a 'B' in a particular course and scored proficient on the end-of-course examination.

Superintendent Doug Adams said that only 1.9 percent of the district's students who received a 'B' in a course failed to become proficient, a significant improvement from recent years, and

the lowest of the three school districts in the county. The graph below shows the districts performance compared to other districts within the county and within our conference.

Grade Inflation is a statistic that is closely monitored by the state and could, in the future, impact a student's abil-

ity to access Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship funds. Superintendent Adams added that the teachers in the district do a fantastic job of aligning our curriculum, setting high expectations for our students, and then teaching those students to the best of their ability.



## TEACHERS ATTAIN NATIONAL BOARD CERTIFICATION

Recently the South Conway County School District partnered with UCA to assist teachers in obtaining National Board Certification.

The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards improves teaching and student learning. National Board Certified Teachers are highly accomplished educators who meet high and rigorous standards.

Like board-certified doctors and accountants, teachers who achieve National Board Certification have met rigorous standards through intensive study, expert evaluation, self-assessment and peer review.

In a congressionally-mandated study, National Board Certification was recently recognized by the National Research Council as having a

positive impact on student achievement, teacher retention, and professional development. The Foundation recognizes and congratulates the following teachers for their achievement:

Regina Chaney, special education at Morrilton High School; Judy Hutchinson, speech pathologist at Morrilton Primary School; Melynda Knapp and Nancy Lacy,

There are several other teachers within the district currently in the process of becoming Nationally Certified.
