2014 RACE TO THE FUTURE SEPT. 23RD

FOUNDATION CONTINUES ITS EFFORTS TO BOOST TECHNOLOGY

On Tuesday evening, September 23rd, the South Conway County Public School Foundation will host the 15th Annual "Race to the Future" Fund-raising Event. Funds raised during this year's campaign will be used to purchase Chromeboxes for use at Morrilton Intermediate School.

Last year the Foundation raised funds to purchase Chromebooks at Morrilton Senior High School. Because of the investment of countless Friends of the South Conway County Public School Foundation, our school district is on the cutting edge of technology among schools in Arkansas and throughout the U.S.

This year we will continue that trend by providing funding to purchase 90 Chromeboxes at the intermediate school. Chromeboxes are the equivalent of a desktop version of a Chromebook. Like Chromebooks, they are optimized for the web's vast educational resources

and integrate rich content into lessons, inspire collaboration and encourage students to create and share their own content with the world. The 90 Chromeboxes will be utilized in labs, one for each grade level, on the intermediate school campus.

Our goal is to raise \$40,000 in order to provide 90 Chromeboxes and monitors for three labs that will be utilized by all students on the campus for researching, creating, and submitting assignments and for PARK assessments which take the place of Benchmark and End-of-Course Exams for grades 3-11.

The District is investing funds to purchase laptops and Chrome devices at Morrilton Primary, Elementary, Junior High, and High Schools. In total the District will begin the year with 363 new devices in the hands of scholars to equip them with 21st century tools.

Inside this newsletter you will find an insert detailing

We hope that you will consider contributing at one of the levels suggested and will join us on September 23rd as we hear from district personnel about how *The Leader in Me* process is impacting our students and staff. Morrilton Primary and Morrilton Elementary are entering their third year as Leader in Me schools. Morrilton Intermediate will begin its second year. The Leader in Me initiative continues to transform our schools and this is an excellent opportunity for you to hear what a difference the initiative is making for the future of our community.

MHS GRADUATION RATE SOARS

Recently, the official graduation rates for 2012-2013 were released. South Conway County School District is celebrating a soaring increase. In 2011-2012, the Morrilton High School graduation rate was 80.63%. This percentage rapidly increased to 91.72% in 2012-2013, an increase of 11.09%!!! To put these numbers in perspective, the State of Arkansas had an average graduation rate of

84.13% in 2011-2012 and 84.94% in 2012-2013. That means that Morrilton High School's graduating class was 6.78% higher than the state average, according to the most recent data.

It takes an entire school community to accomplish a 91.72% graduation rate, one of the highest graduation rates in surrounding areas of the state. We are proud of the efforts of our scholars, families,

community partners, and school-wide staff. Congratulations, South Conway County School District graduates! We expect great things from the class of 2015 this year. Thank you for partnering with South Conway County School District, as the district works to accomplish its mission for every scholar, every day.

ACHIEVING EXCELLENCE ON AND OFF THE FIELD

Historically, South Conway County School District has held to a strong culture of hard work, excellence, and achievement. During the 2013-2014 school year, students represented our community in several state championship appearances.

On December 14, 2013, the Morriston High School Devil Dog Football team was victorious over Batesville in the 5A State Championship. After almost four grueling quarters, Devil Dog fans held their breath as Batesville, attempting to tie the game, missed a field goal wide left with only seconds remaining. The final score

was 27 to 24, awarding Morriston High School its third state championship football title and first state championship football victory since 1973.

South Conway County School District scholars also represented Morriston High School at the 5A State Quiz Bowl Championship where they were awarded the state runner-up title and trophy. The future looks bright for academic quiz bowl competition, with all members of the MHS quiz bowl team returning for their senior year. In addition, the 9th grade quiz bowl team and MIS intermediate team won regional championships in 2014,

with the 9th grade team advancing to the state tournament and placing third.

Shawanna Brockman, 2014 graduate, excelled in track and field events by winning the 5A State Championship in shot put and placing runner-up in discuss.

The future looks bright for the Tennis Team, as Jordan Ryals, only a freshman, placed 3rd at the conference tournament.

The school community celebrates the daily dedication of all student athletes and scholars. It is an exceptional time to be a Devil Dog!!! Go Dogs!!!
